The COE briefed the agenda to be discussed after the introduction of the members.

ITEM:1 To discuss and approve the amendments in the 2017 Regulations & 2018 Regulations.

<u>Amendment VI: Carry Over of Continuous Assessment marks for</u> Reappearance Subjects

(R2017 UG & PG; and R2018 UG & PG; Clause No.6.5.2)

If a student fails to secure a pass in theory / laboratory course in the current semester examination, he/she is allowed to write arrear examinations for the next three consecutive attempts and their continuous assessment marks shall be carried over for the three attempts. The student could optionally re earn the continuous assessment marks by appearing for the assessments. If a student fails to secure a pass in a course even after three consecutive arrear attempts, the student has to redo the course in the semester in which it is offered along with regular students and earn the fresh continuous assessment marks. This is applicable from the year 20-21 onwards.

The Academic Council reviewed and Approved the above changes brought forward by the COE.

Amendment VII: Restriction of ODD /EVEN semester registration & Maximum credit limit in Course Registration

(R2017 UG & PG; and R2018 UG & PG; Clause No.6.5.2)

a. The candidate can register for arrear subjects to undertake the examinations irrespective of odd /even semester in lieu of the previous regulations 2018 to appear in respective odd /even semesters.

The Academic Council reviewed and Approved the above changes brought forward by the COE

b. The restriction in regulations 2017 and regulation 2018 (Amendment–I) limiting the registration to 36 credits is removed as a onetime relaxation for the academic year 20-21.

The Academic Council reviewed and Approved the above changes brought forward by the COE as a onetime relaxation for the academic year 20-21 alone due to COVID-19 Pandemic Situation.

ITEM:2	Approval for Answer Scripts Review
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The Answer scripts review can be held as soon as the results are published. It is restricted to theory papers alone. The details of the evaluator may not be revealed as external members are also called for evaluation.

The Academic Council reviewed and Approved the transparency system and suggested the paper review to be conducted after the Results are published.

Item 3	To discuss on Supplementary Exams
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After the results are published, examinations may be conducted for failed subjects for seventh and eighth semester students within 15 days to provide a chance to complete their course after obtaining permission from the affiliating University

The Academic Council reviewed and Approved the decision and suggested to follow the University guidelines after getting approval from the University.

Item 4	To discuss and approve the Online Course and Grading Pattern
	for the credits earned

This institution is encouraging the students to undertake the NPTEL/SWAYAM COURSES. It is recommended that students can enroll in the course of their choice after getting permission from the Class committee. If the student completes the course the credits will be added based on the certification. The total number of credits earned through Online courses are limited to Six. This credits could be considered in lieu of elective subjects. The Grading Pattern suggested for the credits earned through online course is submitted for Approval.
